Literacy:

Traditional poems for young children:

Children will Read, enjoy and learn Edward Lear's nonsense poems; have fun writing a limerick.

Information texts:

Children will read books about pets; compare these to info. texts; create their own info. pages on a pet.

Postcards & Letters: Be inspired to write letters with excuses; create a letter describing an adventure.

Humorous poems: Children will describe objects to aliens using adjectives; write their own alien poems.

Grammar: Use punctuation marks: capital letters, full stops, question or exclamation marks; use conjunctions and expanded noun phrases to describe and specify.

Numeracy:

The main areas will be:

Number and fractions: Count in 10s and begin to use multiplication; Find halves and quarters of shapes.

Doubling and halving: numbers to 20

Shape and Data: Describe and recognise common 2D shapes; Use Venn and Carroll diagrams to sort.

Addition and subtraction: +/- facts for 20; +/- a single digit from a 2-digit number by bridging multiples of 10; +/- 0, 30, 40, 50 to/from 2-digit numbers using the 1-100 grid; Add 11, 12, 13, 21, 22 and 23.

Mental addition: Add near multiples of 10 by adding a multiple of 10 and adjusting.

Special day/weeks:

Charity, road safety, anti-bullying, learning experience week

Science: Animals, Inc. Humans

To understand:

- the different stages in the human life cycle;
- similarities and differences between living things;
- the characteristics of what different adult creatures need;
- how all living creatures have similar basic needs;
- what we eat and what is healthy;
- that the food we eat can be broken down into food groups;
- the relationship between the food we eat and caring for our teeth;
- the importance of exercise in staying healthy.

Humanities: History The Gunpowder Plot.

- Know when and where Gunpowder Plot took place;
- Know that James I was king at the time of the plot;
- Can use a range of sources to find out who Guy Fawkes was;
- Know what 'Parliament' means and what the 'Opening of Parliament' was;
- Know that the gunpowder was stored in the cellars of the House of Lord;
- Can debate whether the conspirators are right or wrong;
- Can create a newspaper front page report.
