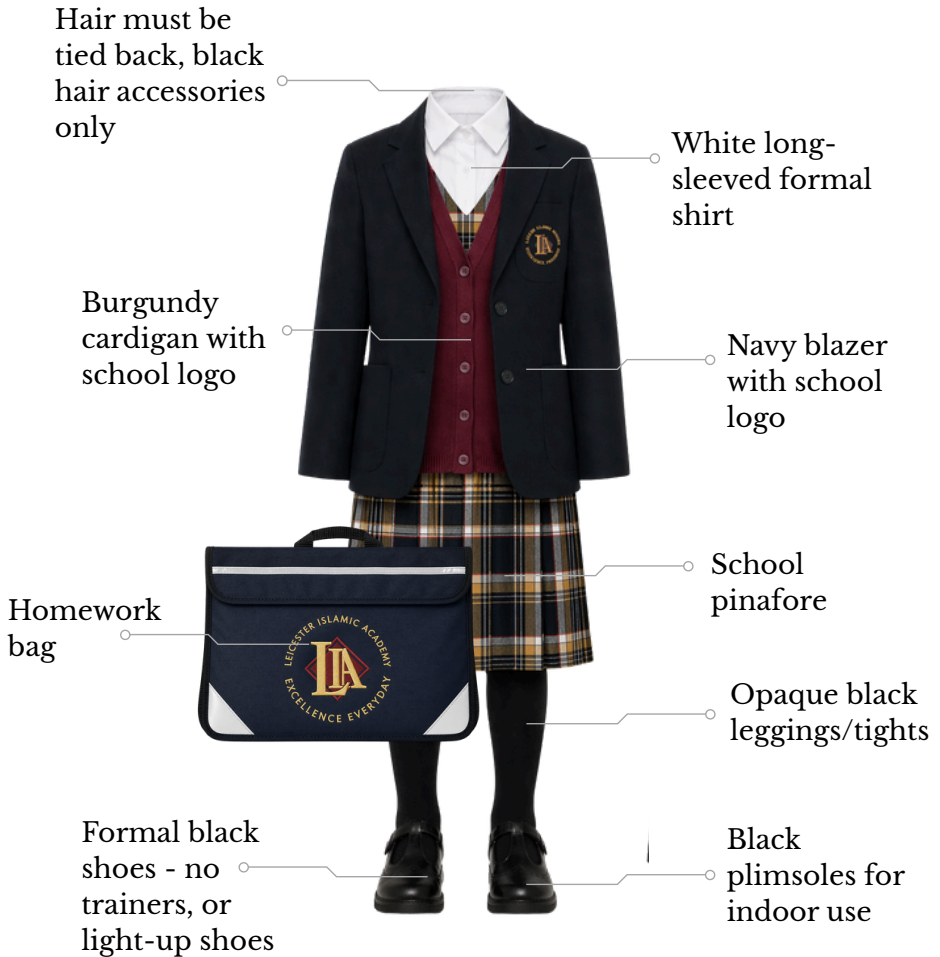

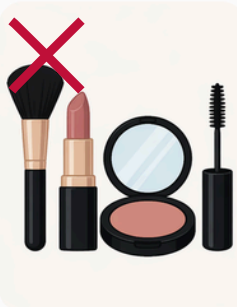

Our Uniform Expectations and Procedures

At Leicester Islamic Academy, we expect all pupils to attend school in the correct uniform each day. We understand that there may **occasionally** be genuine reasons why a child is not in full uniform, and in such cases we ask parents to inform the school as soon as possible.

If a pupil does not attend in the correct uniform, the following steps may be taken:

Step 1

A member of staff will speak to the pupil to enquire regarding the reason and the pupil will be reminded of uniform expectations.

Step 2

Parents will be contacted to clarify the reason and to ensure the matter is resolved promptly.

Step 3

If incorrect uniform becomes a repeated concern without a valid reason, the matter may be followed up by a senior member of staff.

Step 4

If concerns continue, a meeting may be arranged with parents so that the school and family can work together to resolve the matter.

Our aim is always to work in partnership with parents to uphold high standards and ensure that all pupils come to school dressed appropriately, comfortably and ready to learn.



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
