School times

We advise pupils to arrive 5 minutes before school begins.

The normal school day starts at 8.15am and ends at 3.10pm.

Arrival & Collection

Our school gates will open at 8.05am, 10 minutes prior to school starting. Pupils should be in the playground by 8.15am to go to their classrooms. Please do not leave your child unattended before the school gates open as there is no adult supervision.

If you arrive after the school gates have been locked at 8.20pm please go to the main office, where your child will be registered late by a member of the office staff.

Please be punctual when dropping off and collecting your child. The school does operate a late collect charge for pupils who are not collected within 10 minutes of the end of session/school.

Attendance

If your child is unable to attend school, you **must** inform the school office by telephoning 0116 2705343 by 9.30am on each day your child is absent. You must also send in a letter giving a reason for any absence.

All absences are recorded by the school as either authorised or unauthorised and reported to the DfE.

Get your child off to a good start be 100% here, be punctual and be smart!

Routine Appointments & Holidays

Holidays and absence from school other than illness during term time are discouraged and will be unauthorised. Requests can be made to the Head teacher for exceptional circumstances.

Appointments should be made for after school or during school holidays.

Healthy Eating

Healthy Eating Campaign



As part of LIA's healthy eating campaign please encourage your child in eating a healthy breakfast 'as a good night's sleep followed by food in the morning helps me stay active and concentrate more'.

Pupils are encouraged to bring in fruit or vegetables and water to have during their snack break.

Friday Treat Day



During the week **NO** sweets, cakes, crisps, fizzy drinks or chocolate are allowed in school.

Friday's are treat days where they can bring in **ONE** of the above.

Lunch



Only full time children are required to bring a packed lunch.

Or a hot lunch and dessert can be provided for £2.50 per meal. Orders are placed via email to the school office.

School Learning

Curriculum

The school follows the National Curriculum with our Early Years classes following the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

Islamic Studies

We believe in developing young Muslims who, along with aspiring academic excellence, also aspire excellence in Islamic knowledge and spiritualty. For this, our school day will now consist of daily lessons on Qur'an and Islamic Studies. We are certain that inclusion of such lessons will create spirituality in our young children and in our school. To achieve this, we will begin by teaching synthetic Arabic phonics and segmenting in Early years with focus on makharij. In KS1, we will then teach the various vowels and joining symbols. By the end of year 2, students will have learnt how to recite an entire verse fluently and correctly. In KS2, students will continue with their Qur'an lessons with extra focus on tajweed. We are determined in delivering and in achieving excellence for the recitation of the Qur'an.

P.E.

At LIA our P.E. lessons take place in our school hall or playground. We have SFK Coaches who provide lessons and keep our pupils active.



Enrichment Sessions

A scheme that has been put into practice with our own resources and embedded within our Physical Social Health Education (PSHE) and Social Emotional Aspects of Learning (SEAL) and Physical Education (P.E.). The character development values are linked to the termly topics taught.

The enrichment sessions take place on Fridays after the Jumma Prayers, during the last lesson. Children are allocated to different Enrichment Sessions within the school.

The sessions are led by Teachers and Learning Support Assistants. Staff are chosen by their strengths, skill sets and passion in the different areas.

The sessions are as follows:

Wow Walking, ECO Committee, Gardening, Debate sessions, STEM, Sewing, Art & Crafts, Nasheeds and Calligraphy.

These sessions include both practical and reflective learning, with classroom-based review through cross curricular subjects. The main aim is to permit our children to become resilient, confident and share their own skills by creating a school environment where children learn virtues that enable them to be changing mediators in their communities."

This is a very beneficial programme which shows holistic learning by: Planting the seeds of respect and Character Development at an early age in our children's hearts will make it easier for them to seek more knowledge about these values of Islam.

Our aim is to work in partnership with parents, to support every child as they grow up to be a responsible British Citizen.





Homework

Keystage 1 (Year 1, 2)

Homework is given once a week. The class teacher will advise on which specific day it will be given and should be returned. Please refer to your child's school diary.

Keystage 2

Homework is given on:

- Monday homework to be returned to school on Wednesday
- Wednesday homework to be returned to school on Friday
- Friday homework to be returned to school on Monday

All homework diaries should be signed and put back in your child's homework bag. If homework is not done for an unavoidable reason then a signed explanation should be provided.

Homework bags are available from the school office.

Behaviour & Rewards

At LIA we believe that good behavior is central to the raising of academic standards and to the successful development of our children towards achieving excellence in all aspects of their lives.

Children follow the five golden rules in order for them to be on their best behaviour.

➤ Listening ➤ Enjoy learning

At LIA good behaviour is ALWAYS rewarded:

➤ Stickers ➤ Verbal praises ➤ Certificates

➤ Class assembly trophies ➤ Effort chart stickers

We as a Muslim school promote an atmosphere of mutual respect, tolerance and responsibility for each other, and wider community.

Group Rewards

Each pupil is assigned to a House upon admission. As part of the school's tarbiyah programme on 'Positive Behaviour', a system has been introduced that allows pupils to earn house points for their individual houses.

WOW Walking



Our school is participating in the Walk to School campaign. Children and parents are encouraged to walk to school or park and stride. Teachers have a tracker to record how your child came into school.

At the end of each month children receive a badge from Living Streets if they have achieved the monthly target.

LIA encourages parents not to park outside the school gates as it causes congestion and is a hazard towards children going into or coming out of school.

Please be considerate of our neighbours and do not park in a disruptive manner.
